 - (c) “The Louisiana Purchase was the most important event in the expansion of the United States before 1853.” To what extent do you agree with this statement? Explain your answer. [10]

- (a) What happened at Wounded Knee in December 1890? [4]
 - (b) Why did the Sand Creek Massacre lead to a deterioration in the relationship between Native Americans and the US government? [6]
 - (c) To what extent was there a good relationship between Native Americans and the US government before 1850? [10]
