- (c) ‘Christians do not need to take part in public worship.’
Discuss this statement. Give your own opinion and show that you have thought about other points of view. You must refer to Christianity in your answer. [6]

Discuss this statement. Give your own opinion and show that you have thought about other points of view. You must refer to Christianity in your answer. [6]

- 3 (a) (i) What is the relationship between the qiblah (direction) and the mihrab (niche)? [3]
- (ii) Briefly describe the architecture of a mosque. [4]
- (b) Explain the importance of performing salah daily for a Muslim. [7]
- (c) 'It is more important that a mosque has a muezzin than an Imam.'
Discuss this statement. Give your own opinion and show that you have thought about other points of view. You must refer to Islam in your answer. [6]

- (c) ‘The Ner Tamid (eternal light) is the most important symbol that can be seen in a synagogue.’ Discuss this statement. Give your own opinion and show that you have thought about other points of view. You must refer to Judaism in your answer. [6]
