Candidates must answer **one** question.

Drawing and/or Painting from Observation

Candidates are required to make a study or studies, using only **one** side of a sheet of paper, on the following. Studies may be larger than life-size and magnifying lenses may be used.

Natural or Man-made Objects

- 1 A metal, wooden or plastic toy.
- 2 Two plant or vegetable bulbs, rhizomes or tubers with sprouting stems and roots.
- 3 An object with a reflective surface placed on a folded newspaper showing large print and photographs.

Subjects for working out of doors or from a sheltered position

- 4 A table and some chairs outside a house or a shop.
- 5 A view which includes receding telegraph poles or electricity pylons.
