Preparatory studies must be taken into the examination room and **must** be submitted for external assessment together with your final examination work. The entire submission will be assessed as a whole. The preparatory work must consist of not more than **four sides (two sheets of paper)** no larger than A1 (594 × 841 mm) size on which smaller works may be mounted. Candidates may work on smaller paper if they choose.

INFORMATION FOR CANDIDATES

This paper assesses your response to visual stimuli and involves direct observation from primary sources, recording, analysis and 2D and/or 3D development.

Choose **one** of the following questions from **any** section.

From direct observation and personal experience record, analyse and develop your ideas.

Section A is appropriate for **any** Area of Study and may be chosen by candidates who prefer an open-ended starting point.

Section B is appropriate for **any** Area of Study and may be chosen by candidates who prefer a specific starting point **or** alternatively candidates may prefer to approach these topics in an abstract manner if they wish.

Section C may **only** be chosen by candidates who prefer to be offered a specific design brief.

Section B

- 7 Several fruits of different sizes and structures, some arranged in a bowl, with others, peeled and/or sliced, placed on a plate with a knife.
- 8 Packing in progress for a journey; items such as clothes, footwear, toiletries and a few other personal possessions arranged within and around an open suitcase, travelling bag or backpack.
- 9 The whole or the upper half of a person, engaged in reading or writing, seated at a small table in front of some bookshelves.
- 10 A view of a road junction which includes traffic signals, road signs and telegraph or electricity poles.

- 11 Interpret the whole or any part of this extract:

'Through the open doorway of Henry's workshed Mr Sullivan could see a bench with vices, beneath rows of carpenter's tools – hammers, chisels, planes, mallet, spokeshave, pliers, spirit-levels, screwdrivers, wrenches. Two tea-chests were crammed with short pieces of timber of different widths and lengths. Saws and coils of wire, a much used ball of string, and a sickle, hung on hooks.'

- 12 **WINGS** is the name of a club for owners of classic and vintage cars. Design a suitable logo for a membership card and the cover of a newsletter **or** a banner for the club's annual rally.
- 13 From observations of flowering plants, design a Festoon or a Garland to be reproduced and placed above the door and window frames of the interior of a building.
- 14 A game of Chess is to be played on a human scale, using people dressed as the pieces. Design the costume for **two** different chess pieces.
- 15 Using the trade name **HEADSURE** design the packaging for a protective helmet for cycling, motor cycling, cricket or baseball.
