## 1 Translate into Urdu:

Have you ever thought about the relationship between humans and animals? From the earliest times, people have interacted with mammals, fish and birds in a variety of ways. Our ancestors thought of the animal kingdom mainly as a source of food or as a potential threat. Early cave paintings show hunting scenes. One theory is that hunters killed animals which they believed to be dangerous, and then discovered that they were good to eat. Through fighting for survival, mankind had found a new food supply. The next development was to keep certain animals in order to help with tasks, for example transport and farming. It was then only a short evolutionary step to becoming emotionally attached to the work animals and treating them as pets. In recent times machines have taken over the jobs once done by animals and our attitude towards them has changed again. Some people ride horses for pleasure while others breed them for racing. Dogs can be trained to guard property, but they can also be cruelly exploited. Have humans become the worst enemies of their best friends?
